How many players would it have? What would it be called? We are excited to find out what unusual sports we can come up with!
	<b>Imagination Station</b> Famous Inventors	Creativity is a crucial factor in developing your child - and we're here to spark their imagination! Having explored some of the most famous inventors of our time, including Alexander Bell and The Wright Brothers, we will be creating our own telephones and airplanes out of paper cups and glue sticks!
Tuesday 20th July	<b>Sounds and Colours</b> All About Strings	Did you know that some of the earliest string instruments are over three thousand years old? In our ever popular workshop, we will be exploring a lot more about our instruments and your child will even get the chance to create and paint their very own string instrument!
	<b>Performarama</b> Peter and the Wolf	Children will be encouraged to listen to this amazing piece of music together and guess which instrument represents which character and why? We'll think of how the characters are feeling alongside our own emotions about the piece particularly its open ending. Children will create their own masks to take home too!
Wednesday 21st July	<b>Meet the Composer</b> Camille Saint-Saëns	Like Mozart, Saint-Saëns was a child prodigy, composing his first piece at the age of just 3! In this interactive workshop, we will be exploring one of his best known works "The Carnival of the Animals" - specifically how the composer uses music to portray characteristics of animals in each movement.
	<b>Sounds and Colours</b> Carnival of the Animals	One of our most popular workshops is all about combining music and art. Using Camille Saint-Saëns "The Carnival of the Animals" we will be finding out if certain musical elements and expressive qualities can illustrate a certain image and colour? Let's open our doors to the world of colours and endless possibilities!
Thursday 22nd July	<b>Music in Motion</b> Peter and the Wolf	After Tuesday's introduction to Prokofiev's Peter and the Wolf we will delve even further by focusing on the role of the conductor! Everyone will have the chance at waving the baton to different parts of the music. A perfect workshop to develop not only your child's coordination and physical skills but also their understanding of musical concepts.
	<b>Imagination Station</b> Invent an Instrument	Having learnt all about famous inventors and how their most popular items came about, it's time for your child to create their own invention - a twist on an already existing instrument! Your child will use different arts and crafts materials to design, create, and take home their very own instrument. Let's see their innate creativity kick in!
